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
Midwest Child-Parent Center (CPC) Expansion

- CPCs are center-based early intervention programs that provide comprehensive educational and family-support services to economically disadvantaged children from preschool to 3rd grade
- CPCs expect parent participation, and implement child-centered approaches to social and cognitive development for economically disadvantaged children.
- USDE i3 Grant Recipient
 - 2012–2016
 - Validation Category
 - 10% private match required
- Districts
 - Chicago Public Schools :17 schools
 - Evanston Public Schools :4 schools
 - Unit 5 (Normal, IL) :1 school
 - Saint Paul Public Schools: 6 schools



Over 2,300 children have been served in the CPC program

MCPC Requirements: Parent Involvement & Engagement

- 1. The PRT & SCR work with the HT to maintain a supportive parent program PreK-3rd.
- 2. Parents sign a school-home agreement agreeing to participate at least 2.5 hrs/wk.
- 3. Sites maintain records of family participation in an online portfolio.
- 4. Establish a parent involvement plan based on a needs assessment that balances home & school participation and opportunities for educational, career, and personal development.
- 5. Every month, PRTs and Parent Involvement Liaisons create and distribute a monthly parent involvement calendar, which reflects the parent involvement plan.
- 6. PRTs & Parent Liaisons are available to families and teachers
- 7. All families are eligible for a home visit.
- 8. The PRT and Parent Involvement Liaison establish a parent advisory group.
- 9. A resource room dedicated to parent and family activities is available.
- 10. PRTs & Parent Liaisons provide alternative times of day for parent participation.
- 11. PRTs and Parent Liaisons provide parent involvement opportunities for families of all backgrounds. Involvement for other family members is also emphasized.


